# **Bible Reading Matthew 18:15-20**

Jesus said, "If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."

#### Reflection

I think we might all relate to the frustration of not being properly heard or understood, no matter how many words we use. The art of deep listening is a gift and a grace. It takes focus and intent to properly hear, acknowledge and embody what has been expressed to us, and all this before we even begin to frame our view or reply. Listening without any intent is hard!

How many of you replay uncomfortable conversations over and over? The process is rarely satisfying. And in these replays how often is the focus on the words the other said and how much is on your words, particularly those you might wish you had said, or not said at all?

In the gospel passage the word 'listen' is mentioned four times. Jesus obviously knew it is a skill we have to work on! If we have a dispute with another we are to listen (the emphasis isn't on talk) to each other and see if we can reach a better understanding, to try and see (hear) the situation from the others point of view, even if we really do think we are right! If we still can't reach an agreement we are to invite an elder, an outside counsellor (I personally would find a group of 2/3 people quite scary and not overly neutral!) to help in the communication and learning.

Now here it gets more tricky because if we can't hear what is being said we are to be exiled like a tax collector, which seems pretty harsh- especially if you are a tax collector! But, who does Jesus choose to sup with? The tax collector, the excluded. No one is an outcast to God.

We may be exiled from a Church (I have been before twice- once as a child from an Anglican Church for being the wrong skin colour and once as an adult from a Free Church for spending time in an Anglican Church! Others have been rejected for their sexuality, gender identity or for 'just not being the right fit'. Sadly our churches are not always the place of radical welcome Jesus modelled).

We may be exiled from a friendship network or from a family group - and the breaking of these bonds can be traumatic and painful. To be estranged or to be made estranged from family is more common than we might expect and often distressing. But in these moments, these places of pain and exile Jesus meets us and invites us to sit with him. In his presence there is no need for words, yet if we choose to share our heart he listens, listens and holds us and gives us the water of life beyond the intricacies and vulnerabilities of human life and relationships. If we come full of sin, shame and bitter regret he listens, listens, listens and says 'I have paid it all, you are clean, you are welcomed, you are loved'.

May we all know Gods love and acceptance especially in times of exile. **Amen.** 

(NB If you are in one of these situations you may like to talk to me in confidence or to a trusted friend or counsellor, but know that you are not alone and it doesn't just happen to you).
