ROGATION

At this time of the year Rogation Sunday (5th May 2024) is celebrated. We are in the heart of a thriving rural community. As Christians we have a duty to cherish God's creation and care for the environment.

What does Rogation mean? Rogation comes from the Latin verb 'rogare' = to ask. We have to ask God to help us look after his creation, use it wisely and efficiently to enable us to live together. We have to be careful not to turn Rogation Sunday into 'ASKING' Sunday. If we are not very careful asking can be at the centre of our prayer and our understanding of what praying is. It could appear that we are trying to persuade God to do something which he is not in fact already doing because we don't trust him. We are not asking God to do any more than He is already doing. He is looking after his world, although with natural disasters, wars, famine, climate change it appears differently like the recent earthquakes which change countries for many years to come. These are the impacts of centuries of our effect on earth.

Cambridgeshire County Council / East Cambridgeshire District Council Report

Cambridgeshire District Council (CCC)

Buses

As I mentioned last month, I mentioned that the CPCA mayor is looking at bringing in a franchising model, but that has taken a huge step backwards as the independent audit of the model is still being continuing with challenges by the auditor.

That audit has been completed, but details of the proposals are yet to be revealed and the Bus Service Improvement Plan has to be submitted by 12th June to Government.

The increase in precept of 200%, will only allow a small number of extra services. Without any government funding bus improvements will not happen, but despite many requests to see the draft plan, we are now hurtling towards a deadline to get the plan completed. I will keep you updated on the progress on this.

Highways

The state of the roads continues to cause massive concerns and our group continues to push the CCC for more funding into roads maintenance, but more importantly better workmanship. Too many repairs are breaking up within weeks of the repair being done. I mentioned last month about a delay in implementing a new Highways reporting tool. I have now been told that procurement of the new system was stopped in February and a new procurement exercise is underway to source a new system. The current system is not fit for purpose, as it

gives no information on the progress of each request or whether the request has even been accepted. I will continue to update with what process has been made.

Swaffham Heath/ A1303 Crossroads – Staggered Junction

As I mentioned last month, the work on this was due to start on Monday 4th March and last for 15 weeks. The legal issues have now been resolved, but due to the summer events at the Newmarket racecourses, the police have requested that the start date is delayed until September. This is very frustrating to have such a delay in getting road safety improvements to this important junction.

East Cambridgeshire DC

Sanctuary Housing

After meetings with Sanctuary Housing, they have begun a programme of bringing empty properties back into use. I have a meeting with their management at the end of April to see what progress has been made. I will update further next month.
