Ash Wednesday was the start of Lent. The distinctive English word "Lent" is derived from the Anglo-Saxon word for "spring", because Lent always falls in the springtime. Notwithstanding the fact that autumn occurs at this time in the southern hemisphere, the English word has the advantage over the Latin words based on "quadraginta" or "forty" because it calls to mind the new life, growth, hope and change that should characterise this time of prayer, penance and conversion; this season of initiation into the grace life of the Church.

The Lent fast of forty days chiefly commemorates that of Jesus when He went into the wilderness to pray. After He had fasted for forty days and forty nights, He was tempted by the Devil, but overcame the temptations.

The forty days extend from Ash Wednesday to Easter Eve, leaving out the Sundays, which are not fast days.

We can use the time of Lent to reflect and pray. We could still join the Lent Group or why not come to the Mothering Sunday Service at 10.30 at St Mary's Dullingham.

Not all the funding for the tower has yet been assured, but we know that work will be done on the chancel at least at some point this year. At that time we might have to close the church temporarily — we will keep you updated via this newsletter. It will be good to get the work done, but we are hoping that it won't take too many months.

#### Cambridgeshire County Council / East Cambridgeshire District Council Report

#### Cambridgeshire District Council (CCC)

More Traffic Restrictions: The GCP are now looking at road classifications throughout Cambridge, which will restrict traffic even more and, in my opinion, cause more congestion. CCC have a stated aim of getting people out of their cars and use public transport, which is admirable, but it must come with reliable services otherwise that will not happen.

A complete rethink of the road plans for Cambridge is required, but the ruling administration refuse to listen to constructive comments. The ruling administration voted down at a County Council meeting last year, a Conservative group proposal to have a cross party working group to look at the issues and try to resolve them. Working together for all residents. They refused that.

I welcome ideas from residents on how we can solve traffic issues within and outside the City, as people are going elsewhere to shop rather than put up with the congestion. I will continue to put proposals forward that will resolve some of the issues.

**Buses:** The CPCA mayor is increasing the mayoral precept by 200% from £12 to £36 for a Band D property, which will apparently be spent on bus transport including Demand Responsive Transport, one scheme that will be in East Cambridgeshire towards the east of the district, with no change to other services.

There is a potential proposal to move to a franchising model, which will mean that the Combined Authority (CPCA) as the transport authority could dictate where and when buses run, rather than the bus operators, as at present. Franchising costs a lot of money and there is no evidence that the money will be forthcoming from Government, which is the main source, based on previous poor bids that the CPCA have made.

There will be a public consultation on this later this year, once the Business Case has been published, so I will update once more details are known.

County Council Budget: The CCC decided at a meeting on 13th February to increase their portion of the Council tax by 4.99%, which is the maximum allowed. Our group put forward proposals to spend the money differently and put over £20m more into repairing our roads, but that was rejected. The County Council has nearly £300m of reserves so this was achievable.

#### Swaffham Heath/ A1303 Crossroads – Staggered Junction:

I have some great news. After a very long wait due to legal issues purchasing land around the junction, construction is due to start on Monday 4th March and last for 15 weeks.

This has been a long time coming, but I hope that this finally improves road safety at this important junction.

#### **East Cambridgeshire District Council**

**ECDC Budget :** East Cambs District Council voted on 20th February a NIL % increase in their portion of the Council tax. This is for the eleventh year running, without any reduction in service.

Waste Services: Government is working on changing the way that waste is collected and there will be a uniform system across the country, where at the present each Council can choose their own method. More detailed proposals will be issued over the coming months, with an implementation date likely to be 2026.
